#### Executive Director Letter

Hello SAM25 Friends! Spring has sprung a little early in Wisconsin and we are loving this beautiful weather! We feel fortunate to have had such warm temperatures here at SAM25. It always makes things so much easier for everyone when the snow melts.

With spring has come the start of phase two of our renovation projects: the SAM25 Community Health Clinic. We are thrilled to see the implementation of this final program. Thanks to the awesome contractors for their work. We are grateful for all they have done! If you've driven past our building, you may have noticed that our new siding is up. The blue house with the yellow door - it matches our logo and will be an easy place for everyone to find! We are so excited to see these final renovations take place. We also recently received our washer and dryer sets from Heins Appliance, donated by Twig's Beverage and the Shawano Masonic Lodge. The conference room is fully furnished now too! The 100 Plus Women Who Care of Shawano County funds were used to purchase tables and chairs for our STS Room, allowing us to offer classes and have a place to hold meetings!

We have also been working on getting the thrift store up and running. Leadership Shawano County has been helping us with this project. A few weeks back, we held a soft opening on a Saturday and it turned out really well. We are looking forward to additional soft opening dates on March 20 and 27 (See page 4 for flyer) before officially implementing a weekly schedule this Spring. Stay tuned for more details and watch our website/social media for announcements. If you drive by and see a sign outside that the thrift store is open, stop in!

Hard to believe it, but we are already nearing the end of our first shelter season in our new building. I feel like a broken record, but I can't say it enough: this new space has made it possible to keep our guests, staff and volunteers safe through a really tough year. It hasn't been easy, but we are taking it one day at a time. Without this space, it would have been much more difficult. The men, women and children we serve are thankful for a safe place to go and we are thankful for all of you who make it possible!

While the shelter season may be soon coming to a close, SAM25 is still available all year to those in need. We have hired an official Resource Manager in our Resource Center; an already familiar face, Chris Ciucci, will be staying on throughout the offseason to continue her work with those in need. Chris is here during the day to help with the needs of those we serve. If you know of someone who needs assistance, please send them over to SAM25 to get some help. Our Resource Center is now open Mondays through Thursdays 9am – 2pm. Stop in at the yellow door out front during these hours if you need anything!

As always, none of this would be possible without the support of our beloved Shawano and Menominee Communities (and beyond!). There are so many people and organizations who reach out to help. It is amazing! Thanks to each and every one of you.

# Steps to Success Update By: Chris Ciucci

Hello! Steps to Success, (STS) programs have been working nicely with varied presentations being well received by guests. We've offered 14 presentations with 40 people in attendance to date. Some of the recent ones included topics such as Communication, Ways to Make Money, Wellness, Housing and Time Management. Additional courses relative to COVID Now, Mental Illness, Budgeting and Resumes are still upcoming.

Having guests partnered with staff for a mentor has proved valuable as there is continual communication for help and follow up. So far this season, we've had 42% of our guests move on to more permanent housing circumstances.
